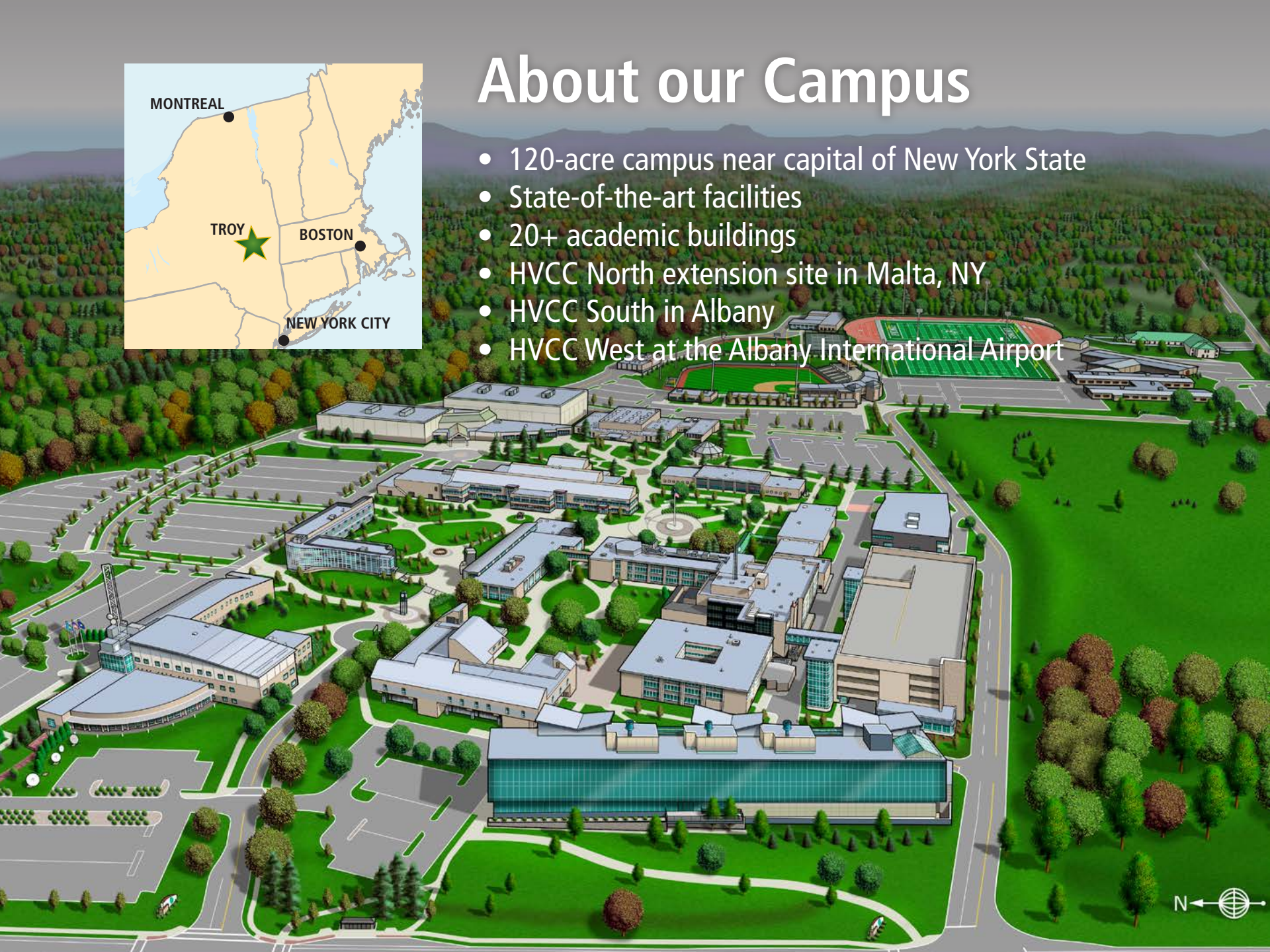

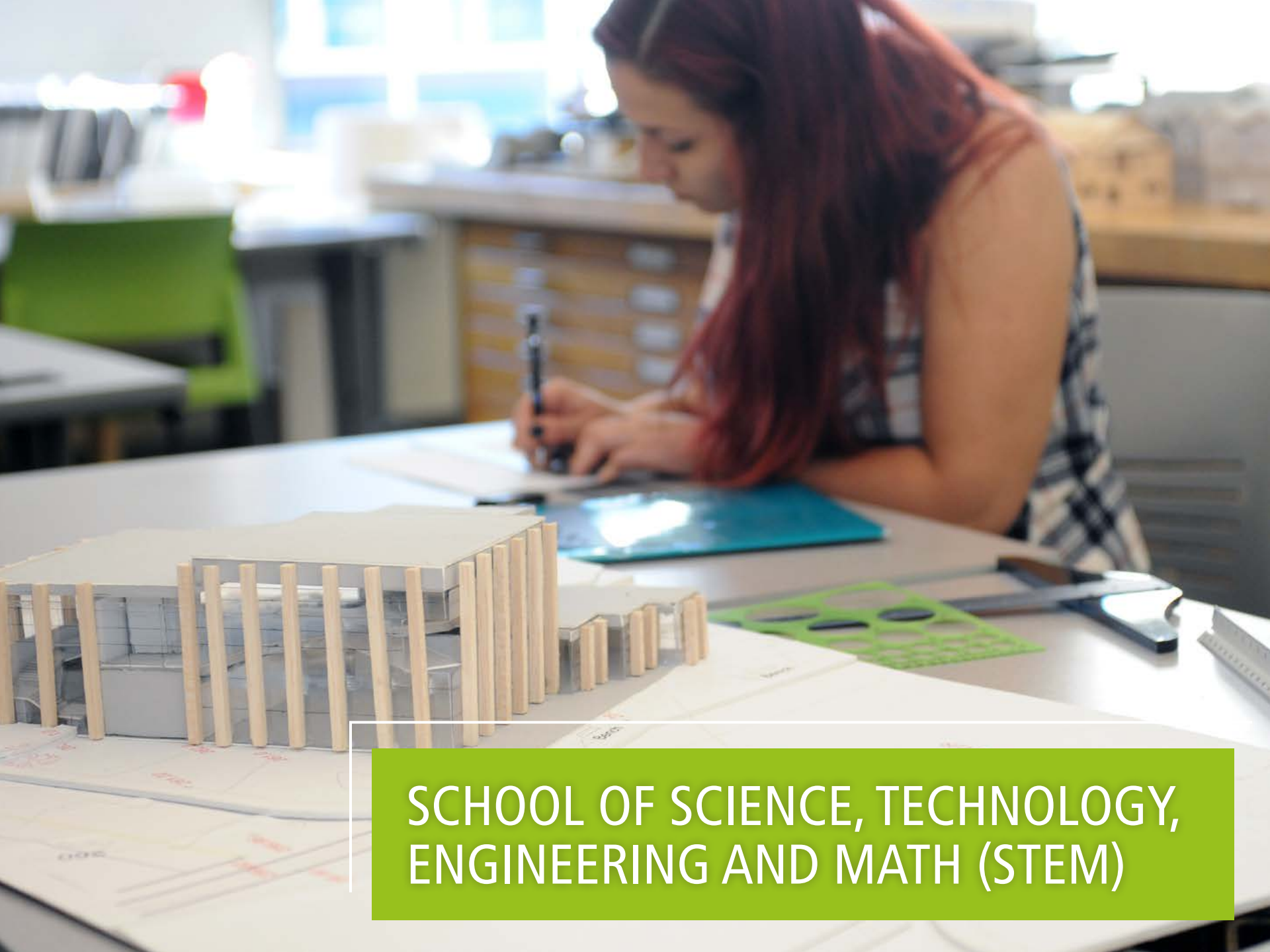

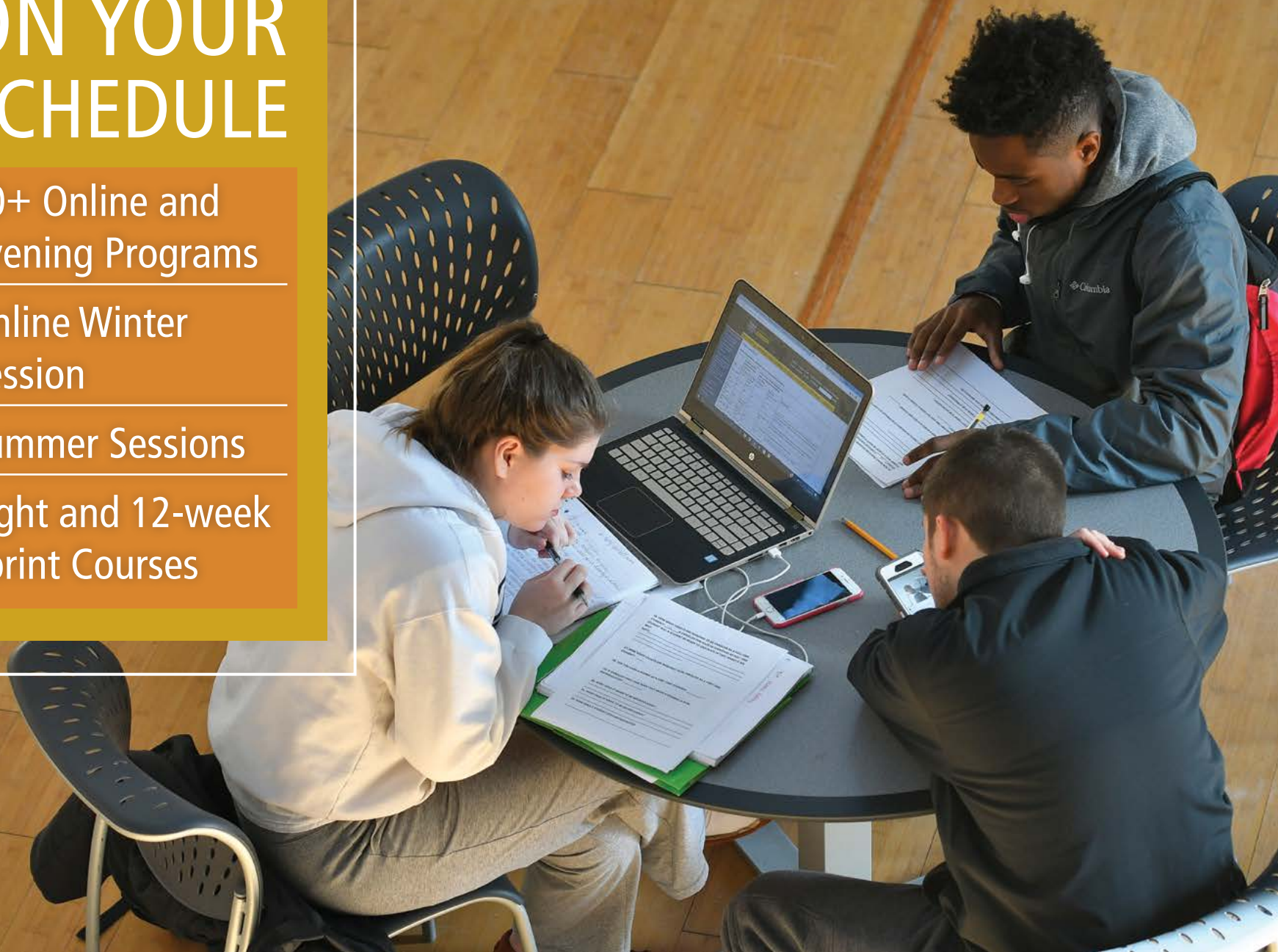

CUSTOMIZED CREDITED AND NON-CREDITED PROGRAMS

Through the Division of Workforce Development and Community Education, the college can develop credited and non-credited programs to address the changing needs of our local and global community. For example, the college remotely delivers non-credit English as a Second Language instruction, to students and teachers, both inside and outside the United States.

Further, the Division of Workforce Development and Community Education provides professional development and training for individuals, businesses and organizations, with the ability to create customized programs to meet specific training needs. This includes an on-campus, five-day intensive Electric Vehicle Train-the-Trainer Program that was developed for automotive instructors and students from Central America. Individuals from Costa Rica, Ecuador, El Salvador, and Colombia have participated in the program.



DISTANCE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

The Global Classroom High School Program allows high school students outside of the United States, to take college-level courses, at a reduced cost, for which they will receive college credit upon their successful completion.

- All of the courses are taught asynchronously online, enabling students to access all of the course materials, assignments, lectures and tests at any time, when it is convenient for them.
- All of the courses use either free Open Educational Resources, which will be available online, or materials with free digital access. Therefore, students will not need to purchase or receive course materials!

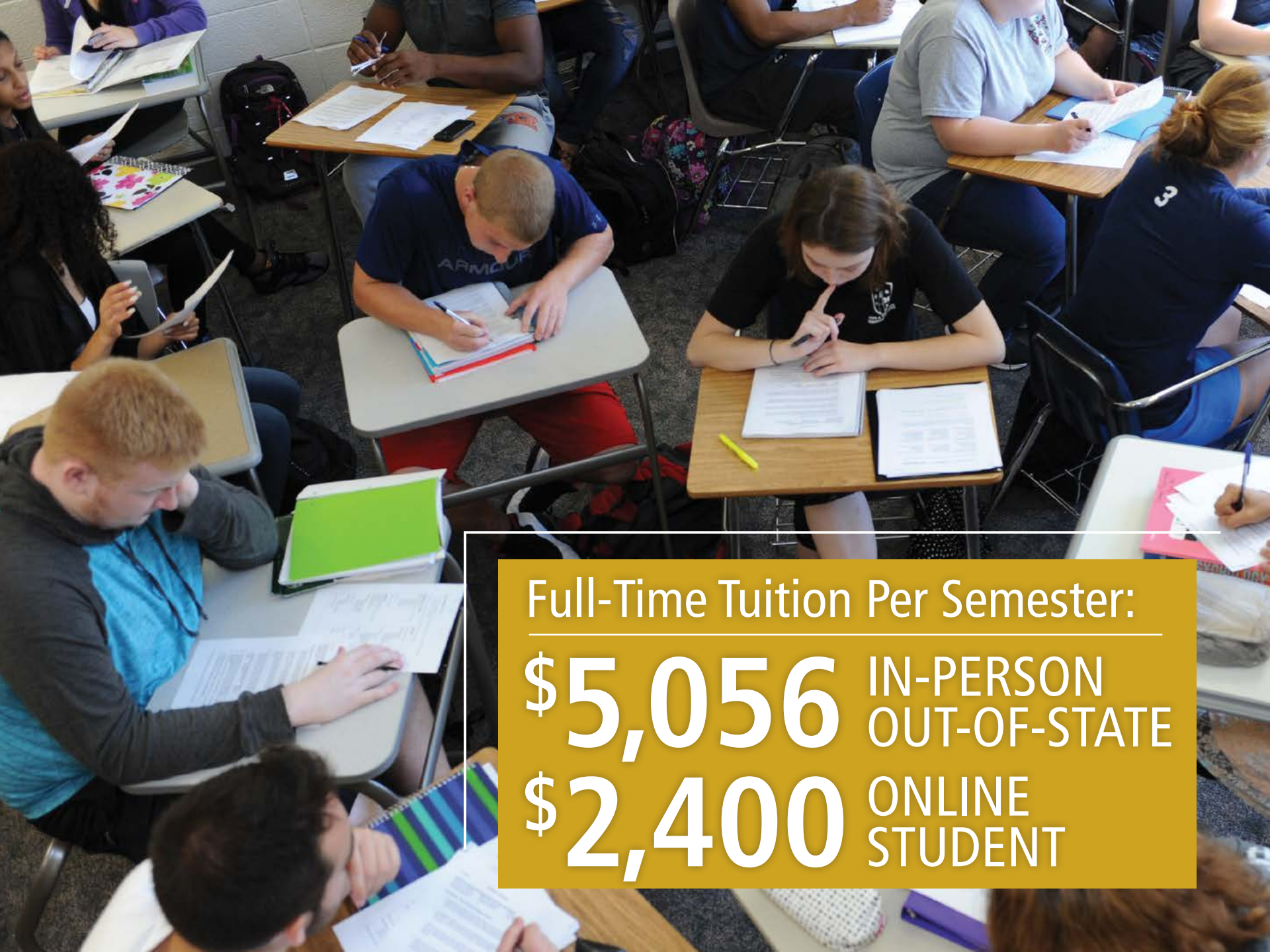
