**<u>Resolved</u>**, that the following curriculum changes, as recommended by the Academic Senate and the President, be, and hereby are, approved:

#### A. SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND LIBERAL ARTS

#### 1. Education and Social Sciences Department Changes to Existing Courses:

#### • <u>POLS-215 Honors Current Issues in Politics</u> Change in course title and description to offer as part of the new Honors College program

#### • <u>PSYC-105 Honors Exploring the Human Mind</u>

Change in course description to reflect the new Psychology A.A. degree and New Honors College.

#### • <u>PSYC-280 Experimental Psychology</u>

- Change in prerequisites taking PSYC 100 and PSYC 275 before taking PSYC 280 will better prepare students for the material covered in PSYC 280. Knowledge of both PSYC 100 and PSYC 275 are necessary for the final project students must complete for PSYC 280.
- 2. Change in course description, activities and assignments this will ensure only students who are prepared for the rigor of the course are allowed to take the course, students need a solid knowledge of psychology and college-level work experience to be successful in the class.
- 3. Student behavioral objectives changes to student behavioral objectives better reflect the current focus and content of the course. The new objectives also align with the Psychology A.A. degree.

#### • <u>ENGL-107 Honors Composition I</u> Change in course description – the new language reflects the new Honors College.

## • EMSP-230 Critical Applications for Paramedicine

The department seeks to change the course content to keep up with accreditation requirements and change prerequisites.

#### • EMSP-205 Special Topics for the Paramedics

The department seeks to change the course name from Operations for the Paramedic to Special Topics for the Paramedics and changes in objectives and course description.

### Dental Assisting Certificate

The Dental Assisting program will be offered at the HVCC North Campus in the Fall 2023 semester. The expansion of the program at the North Campus will allow increased enrollment and increased accessibility for the norther capital district students. construction of a new state of the art building, to offer more lab space, and enrollment possibilities.

#### <u>New Program:</u>

#### • <u>Health and Wellness Studies, A.S.</u>

The Health and Wellness degree program will be offered in full at the HVCC North Campus in the Fall 2023 semester. This will allow HVCC students to complete the A.S. degree completely on the North Campus or online. The expansion of the program at the North Campus will allow increased enrollment and increased accessibility for the norther capital district students. The HVCC North Campus is physically expanding, including the construction of a new state of the art building, to offer more lab space, and enrollment possibilities.

#### New Certificate:

### Health Sciences Certificate

The Health Science Certificate program will be offered in full at the HVCC North Campus in the Fall 2023 semester. This will allow HVCC students to complete the certificate completely on the North Campus. The expansion of the program at the North Campus will allow increased enrollment and increased accessibility for the norther capital district students. The HVCC North Campus is physically expanding, including the construction of a new state of the art building, to offer more lab space, and enrollment possibilities.

#### **Changes to Existing Certificate:**

#### Health Sciences Certificate

Changes in certificate requirements:

- 1. Changing the "Restricted Math Elective" to MATH 099 (0 credits) is advantageous to the students because MATH 099 is a pre-requisite/entry requirement necessary for many of the health science programs in the past, MATH 099 was not able to count towards the HEC program.
- 2. Changing the number of required credits in the "Restricted Electives" category (increased from 4 to 6 credits) allows more flexibility for the student to seamlessly transfer into other health science programs if they are not admitted into the more competitive programs. Flexibility will also be enhanced adding courses to the list of restricted electives.
- 3. Reducing the total credit requirements to 24

### C. <u>School of STEM</u>

# 1. Applied Technologies Department <u>New Program</u>:

#### • <u>Clean Energy Management, A.A.S.</u>

The Clean Energy Management A.A.S. program will be offered in full at the HVCC North Campus in the Fall 2023 semester. This will allow HVCC students to complete the A.A.S. degree completely on the North Campus. The expansion of the program at the North Campus will allow increased enrollment and increased accessibility for the northern capital district students. The HVCC North Campus is physically expanding, including the construction of a new state of the art building, to offer more lab space, and enrollment possibilities.

# • Mechatronics, A.O.S.

The Mechatronics, A.OS. program will be offered in full at the HVCC North Campus in the Fall 2023 semester. This will allow HVCC students to complete the A.O.S. degree completely on the North Campus. The expansion of the program at the North Campus will allow increased enrollment and increased accessibility for the northern capital district students The HVCC North Campus is physically expanding, including the construction of a new state of the art building, to offer more lab space, and enrollment possibilities.

## Change to Existing Course:

# <u>AUTO-240 Advanced and Autonomous Vehicles</u>

Change in prerequisites – the change to the prerequisite for AUTO 240 will add another option, AUBR 160, for different programs to use this course effectively.

### 2. Computer Science and Mathematics

### New Course:

# • CISS-103 Introduction to Artificial Intelligence

The reason for this new course, Introduction to Artificial Intelligence, is to give students an overview of the emerging field of Artificial Intelligence (AI). The use of AI is expanding rapidly in fields such as manufacturing, health care, and transportation – demand for AI familiarity and job skills is predicted to increase

by more than 38% by 2030 (Grand View Research, 2022). This course will allow students to learn the definition of AI and how to identify what is and isn't AI, as well as the societal and cultural impacts of AI. They will become familiar with several primary sub-areas of Artificial Intelligence, and how they are applied in various industries; they will also learn about and use the AI project cycle process. This knowledge and experience will enable students to understand how AI is affecting their workplaces and daily lives, allow them to make more informed decisions concerning the use and application of AI tools, and give them a foundation on which to build further AI learning and proficiency.

# **3.** Engineering, Architecture, and Manufacturing Department *New Programs:*

### • Construction, A.O.S.

The new Construction A.O.S. is being proposed to allow the current and future Construction Certificate students to further their studies to receive an Associates Degree by continuing with two more semesters of studies with the new A.O.S. degree. This new Construction A.O.S. degree will give the Construction students more degree options to pursue their educational needs to be more marketable in the industry.

# • Engineering Science, A.S.

The Engineering Science, A.S. program will be offered in full at the HVCC North Campus in the Fall 2023 semester. This will allow HVCC students to complete the A.S. degree completely on the North Campus. The expansion of the program at the North Campus will allow increased enrollment and increased accessibility for the norther capital district students.
